Most of the links provided in this document take you to amazon.com, but you can shop around online or locally as much as you please. Unless otherwise noted, students all need to have the same exact books as the teacher to avoid confusion and so that classroom time is not wasted getting everyone “on the same page.” It is best to search by ISBN number to be sure you are getting the correct edition of the correct book. Be careful, as sometimes a website’s listing might not be entirely accurate (*caveat emptor!*). If you have any trouble finding an ISBN number on a website, try removing any hyphens. Also, Amazon sometimes directs you to a sponsored listing or an alternative edition that might not exactly match by ISBN number. Amazon “Marketplace” used book sellers are simply individuals conducting transactions via Amazon and those listings might or might not be entirely accurate. Book rentals are usually priced per semester, and you would typically need a book for the entire year at GCA. Be sure to order in plenty of time to receive your student’s books by August 14 (when classes start). Some sellers will send by media mail, which can take weeks to arrive.

**Note:** The Book Sale website is intended only for Greyfriars families. The document simply lists the books for sale, and interested buyers will contact the sellers directly to arrange a transaction. If you wish to sell, add your listing. Be sure to remove the listings that have sold, to save yourself and others from inquiries for books no longer available.

To protect the contact information of families listing books, a password is required if accessing the Book List from our website. After clicking the “Used Books for Sale” link from the website Book List, a document virtually identical to this one will be opened, but will require a password (provided in an email to Greyfriars families; contact the school office if you cannot find it). After clicking the “Used Books for Sale” link again in the new version, individuals will be taken to the website listing books for sale.

### **Kindles and Other e-book Readers:**

Many of the required books are available much more cheaply in electronic format than printed (and weigh a lot less!). Kindles or other e-readers are welcome, but parents should approach that decision with great discretion. Our school policy is that laptops, Kindles, tablets, phones, mp3 players and other similar devices are not allowed to be powered on at all during the school day. However, if a student receives express permission from the school office, a device such as a Kindle or e-reader can be used solely for reading or taking notes during class (i.e. not for any other purpose during school hours, including breaks). These devices must be in “airplane mode” (without any wireless or cellular connections) throughout the school day. Our experience has been that the temptation, especially for underclassmen, to send or receive a text, browse the Internet, check email or use electronic devices in some other way that is not allowed (play a game, play a video, etc.) has proven too much for most students. Further, most of the time active reading is helped by taking notes. While a student could jot down notes electronically or in a notebook, reading a physical book with a pencil in hand continues to be the most effective plan for most students.
